

To clarify the situation all persons and spouses of Kastellorizians and their descendents between the age of 18 and 65 must each pay an annual \$10 membership fee to be a financial member with voting rights. To be eligible to be a non-fee paying member (over 65s) with voting rights you must have been a financial member for 3 years prior to receiving the non-fee paying status. Also non-fee paying members must register each year to keep their voting status. It is with great pleasure that the Kastellorizian Association of Victoria announces that the 2010 Kastellorizian of the Year will be awarded to Mr. Nicholas G. Pappas form Sydney. Many members will know Nicholas either through one of his many books on Kastellorizo, his web site, castellorizohistory or from the article in the "Cool to be Kazzie" section (November 2007) in our very own Kazzie News.

For those of you who don't know of Nicholas's achievements, read his following CV and we are sure you will agree with the selection committee that Nicholas is worthy of the title, Kastellorizian of the year, 2010.

Nicholas Pappas is of Kastellorizian descent as his parents were born on Kastellorizo. Nicholas was born in Sydney in 1961 and obtained his law degree at the University of NSW and began practicing in 1984. In 1996 he established his own law firm Nicholas G Pappas& Company. Nicholas has also completed a PhD on Economic History from the University of Sydney. Nicholas is married to Helene, a lawyer, and they have twins, George & Marina.

Nicholas has two passions. The first is NRL football, primarily the Rabbitos and second, Kastellorizian History. Nicholas has had a long standing association with the Rabbitos. He was the Club's legal adviser in its battle for reinstatement to the NRL after its exclusion from the competition in 1999. In 2003, he became chairman and, in 2006, he supported and oversaw the Rabbitos's partial privatisation by Russell Crowe and Peter Holmes a Court.



Katoumaria Day Report

On Sunday 13th of September The Kastellorizian Association of Victoria held a Katoumaria demonstration to demystify the process of making Katoumaria and to pass down the traditions and recipes to the younger generation.

Katoumaria as we all know, is a sweet specialty of Kastellorizo. It is made to celebrate the happy occasions for example "logos", engagements, weddings and births. The process of making Katoumaria is a time consuming process that that requires a lot technical skill. Both the technique and the recipes are shrouded in mystery and secrecy and are often passed on to the next generation from mother to daughter or daughter-in-law.

In a "MasterChef" style "pressure test", Connie Gregory and Evelyn Salvaris both demonstrated their skills and shared their family recipes with about 30 members of the Association.

Connie demonstrated her skills using the traditional method, kneading by hand. Evelyn took on a more modern approach using modern kitchen appliances. Melbourne Katoumaria expert, Vera Constance, then examined the Katoumaria for the Chefs authenticity, the flakiness and appearance and taste of the Katoumaria. Vera judge harshly, disapproving of the modern techniques and announced that the traditional method produced the best Katoumaria.

Everyone who attended enjoyed the Katoumaria irrespective of how they were made.

Kastellorizian Association of Vic General Reports

Membership Report by John Karis and Sandra Varvodic




Figure 1 – Percentage types of members as at 15th March 2010

As of 15th March 2010, the Kastellorizian Association has 364 recorded entries on its mailing list. Figure 1 shows the percentage of members on our mailing list. A total of 223 members are eligible to vote on any issues that will be raised at the 2010 AGM. This represents 61% and includes fee-paying and non-fee paying or former "honorary" members.

This percentage has increased significantly since last year due to list revision as a result of out-dated address details and 'non-Kazzie' registrations. It is also been impacted by a concerted effort to ensure members renew registrations based upon the fiscal year Jul 09 to June 10 and the new rate of \$10 per person which was introduced to simplify the process.

The reduction in the size of the mailing list has also meant that we can reduce some costs associated with mailing out the Newsletters and other correspondence. Due to the nature of the membership demographics the majority of people prefer a copy to be mailed to their home address.

It would, therefore, be a great assistance if you could provide an email address, either your own or a family member, to which we can email the Newsletter and all other information throughout the year. This will reduce our postage and administration costs plus enable us to provide a more modern Newsletter which can be viewed in colour and contain additional information in a 'link' format. That is, you can assess this additional information if and as required.

Remember: If you are not registered as a paidup member or not paid your subscription for the 1st July 09 to 30th June 10 please do so immediately as the next financial year subscription is due soon. If you are uncertain as to your membership status please contact John Karis on 0412 662 079.

It continues to be a challenge to work towards making <u>www.kastellorizo.com.au</u> a major website for information and news of Kastellorizian nature. The main audience is Australia and Australian Greeks, however, we still receive strong interest from overseas.

The challenge has been to continue to maintain our presence on search engines such as Google in an endeavour to achieve the highest possible rankings. This has involved the following strategies:

Search Engine Optimization Marketing

This is basically how we can improve our Google/Yahoo etc rankings so that we are listed first or near the top of the list when visitors search for 'Kastellorizo' or 'Castellorizo' or 'Megiste' or 'Megisti' or 'Greek Orthodox calendars' or 'Greek Name Days', 'Kazzie immigration' and so on ... It's what you key into the search criteria that uses this to find websites showing relevant information. However, this is only one aspect as there are important considerations such as having relevant information on the website which represents what the visitor expects to see. So, good content is also critical.

Megiste page

We found that searches on "Megiste" did not bring up our website at all so we added a special page devoted to 'Megiste". This means that now when you search on 'Kastellorzio Megiste', for example, our website appears first on Google searches when previously we didn't rate at all.

Blog

In keeping with 'social networking' proliferation we have also added a BLOG page to the website so that visitors can post information about a subject and invite others to respond.

Facebook

There is an opportunity here to 'tap' into other groups and demographics who may not visit our website or be aware of its existence. We are aware that there is a 'Kastellorizians around the Globe" Facebook group which has 690 odd members so I became a member of this group in order that I could ensure they were aware of us in an attempt to 'drag' them to our website. This is an opportunity to also advise them of the Genealogy section which appears to be a common conversational topic within this Facebook group.


Website Statistics for the period 1st July 09 to 12th March 2010


Country Usage

Kastellorizian Association of Vic General Reports Newsletter

By now you would have had a chance to flick through your newsletter and you would have noticed some major changes. It is more concise and a number of the features are not included.

You may ask why has the newsletter has taken on this format?

If you attended last year's AGM, you would be a wear that there was great debate about the outgoing costs of the newsletter in 2008-2009.

Last year's AGM Report compared the newsletter expenses for 2008-2009 with 2007-08. The **2008-09 expenditure appeared to be greatly increased**. However the value quoted in the AGM Report for the 2008-09 expenditure headed "newsletter" was the **total cost of the printing for 2008-09 and <u>not just</u> the newsletter expenses**. It should be noted that these costs included the expenditure of all flyers, the Art Exhibition invitations and catalogues, the AGM Report etc as well as the newsletter. When the breakdown of the costs was explained to the members, the explanation was ignored. The members concluded that cost of the newsletter was too high and over budget and must be reduced.

It is difficult to understand how the newsletter expenses could have exceeded the budget when a <u>newsletter</u> <u>budget</u> has <u>never</u> issued by the committee, despite the subject being raised on a number of occasions.

It is also amazing that the members present at the AGM cannot justify spending the money on the newsletter or understand the importance of this document especially when:

1. The Newsletter has received national and international acclaim from other Kastellorizian Associations.

2. Has generated interest amongst, and received many good comments from the younger members of our community.

3. Provides a valuable and extensive source of information for the Website

4. And is a means of documenting our history (past and present), customs and traditions for future generations

So how can the cost be reduced?

The **first** way to abide by the decision made at the AGM, is to act on the second criticism received from some members and that is that the "newsletter is too long!" and not all of the content of interest (to them). Please note the first criticism is the costs.

But what should be removed?


To answer this, a brief analysis indicates that the newsletter content can be divided into to 3 categories:

1. Essential Content – Announcements and reports of the activities of the Kastellorizian Association of Victoria.

2. Relevant but <u>not</u> essential Content – this includes website report, Affiliated Associations functions and reports, News from Kastellorizo and Social announcements

3. General interest – History, Customs and traditions, Proverbs and sayings, Cool to be Kazzie, Kazzie Kerasma, Lost and Found, photos and the Cover.

The graph below illustrates the breakdown of proportions of Essential, Related Non-Essential and General Interest Content that appeared in the last of the Kazzie New in July 2009 (32 pages).



Each category is essential for making the "Kazzie News" a high quality newsletter and it is with <u>great</u> <u>disappointment</u> that the General Interest Content will no longer appear.

Also commencing with this edition, the Relevant Non-Essential Content will be reduced/highly edited.

In doing so, the content of this edition of the newsletter has been reduced by 37.5%, compared to July 2009. This reduction is at the expense of quality.

In the next edition, the **second** approach will be introduced to **further cut costs**, by **restricting the photographic content** submitted to **1 to 2 photographs per submission**.

And **thirdly**, the **mailing list will be reviewed**, yet again, to further reduced the number of copies printed and mailed out.
