MEDITERRANEO A CAPTIVATING EXPERIENCE"

We print the following letter from new Generation Page. Neos Kosmos by Peter G. Jasonides who is a financial member of our Society.

"Last Tuesday, in the company of five Castellorizians, two Macedonians (i.e. naturally Greeks from Northern Greece) and one Euvoian, this humble scribe, of Pontian descent arrived at the newly opening and elegantly plush Cinema Nova, perhaps as a result of my sense of loyalty to and love of the Castellorizian community in Australia. To be honest I was expecting to see an art-farty type film, I came out, though, enthralled, flabbergasted.

What we had the privilege of viewing was a work of film art. A captivating mix of sharp yet very sensitive dialogue, and a plot that kept us glued to our seats.

Mediterraneo is set on the acritic island of Meghisti (or Castellorizo as we now know it) during the second world war 1941). A group of eight misfit Italian soldiers and a donkey are sent to the island on what should have been a four month mission to guard Castellorizo in the name of Mussolini, as it was considered of strategic importance.

The soldiers have been more or less forgotten on the island after, upon their arrival, their boat was bombarded; stranded. Yet they all have hope that it is only a matter of time before their comrades come to their rescue.

Revealing more of the plot would spoil it for those who may go to see the film.

Though the film is in English sub-titles and predominantly Italian dialogue, it is simple and enjoyable to follow and not at all tiring, as many such films sometimes tend to be.

From an artistic perspective Mediterraneo certainly deserves the accolades it has received: 1992 Academy award for best foreign film, 1992 Italian Oscar for best film of the year. In the United States of America, Mediterraneo is the second highest grossing foreign film ever released.

The cinematography is, to say the very least, spectacular, with scenes of an island unspoiled of tourism even today. The scenery embraces the viewer with its characteristically natural beauty, a beauty that abounds the isle of Castellorizo.

I can recommend the film highly, as the experience is sureto remain vivid. On a scale of 1-10, a rating of 10 is justified.
