Greek Womens' Clinic

We are indebted to Mrs. Katina Voyage for passing on to us information pertaining to the Greek Womens' Clinic. We publish the complete information:

GREEK WOMEN'S CLINIC

The Baker Medical Research Institute is pleased to advise that a Greek Women's Clinic has now opened at

the Baker Institute and will be officially launched on Friday 12th August at 10.30 am in the Institute Library.

It is well recognised that there are few if any such services available to women from non-English speaking backgrounds, especially in the older age groups. The result is a well-documented under-utilisation by these women of screening procedures for cervical and breast cancer and inadequate assessment of an education about risk factors for cardiovascular disease and osteoporosis. It is likely that in the absence of preventive health strategies the risks of these illnesses are significantly increased.

We have thus decided to develop a new service for Greek-speaking women, as Greek people make up the largest non-English speaking group in the vicinity of the Alfred Hospital. Because there has been little research in this area and because Greek women face some special issues, we have decided to link the introduction of this service with a substantial research project. This will involve a series of in-depth interviews with the women about their main health concerns, their expectations and their apprehensions about visiting doctors. It will also include the collection of demographic and biological data which may help define special problems in this area.

The interviews will be conducted over a two year period by a trained research worker, who, where necessary, will also act as a translator. The Clinic wil include Greek-speaking doctors and have available to it specialist services in endocrinology and gynaecology and the full range of facilities of the Alfred Hospital. It will be supervised by a consulting physician, Dr Paul Komesaroff MB, BS, BSc(Hond), PhD, FRACP who will be the Physician in Charge of the Clinic. The research project will also involve a research worker and a sociologist.

As you know, the Baker Institute is involved in a wide range of activities in medical research with a primary focus on cardiovascular medicine. The new service will also offer women the opportunity to participate in research projects into the menopause.

Ongoing studies in which we are involved concern the effects of sex hormones and other factors on vascular reactivity and the stress response, the mechanisms of flushing in the menopause, the assessment of bone turnover and the changes in lipid metabolism around this time.

The establishment of this service has been undertaken after close consultation with the Greek community, especially the Greek medical community. We would like also to emphasise that it is our aim to complement the work of patients' GPs.

The service operates on Thursday afternoons. Women interested in finding out about the Clinic and the research can call 5224301.

We would be very grateful for any help you can give in letting people know about this service and especially about this research project.

President's Report

Presented To The 69th Annual General Meeting Sunday, 9th October , 1994

On behalf of your Board of Management, I present to you the Annual Report of the Castellorizian Association of Victoria for the 1993-1994.

Your present Board, over the past 2 years, have worked diligently and prudently in conducting the affairs of your Society.

REBUILDING - Stage 1 of our re-building has been completed and all costs have been met from existing funds. No borrowing was necessary. Thanks must go to our Sub-committee and in particular to Michael Spartels; without his building knowledge and expertise, the cost of re-building would have been far greater.

THE BOARD - I express many thanks to the Board for their hard work and attendance at Board Meetings. As I repeat in all Reports, all Board Members are volunteers. I hope that we will see more members joining the Board for the 1994-1996 term.

CASTELLORIZIAN OF THE YEAR - Thank you also to our Sub-committee for their work over the past 2 years in selecting the Castellorizian of the Year. Members who have served on the Sub-committee were Nick Adgemis, John B. Salvaris O.A.M., Jasmine Verginis, Florence Livery, Sandra Varvodic, Dr Spiro Moraitis, Dr George Stabelos, Dr Michael Piperoglou, Cynthia Koutsoukis and Jack Bisas O.A.M. Special thanks to Sandra Varvodic for her Secretarial skills. 1992-1994 has ben a period of many achievements for our society. The introduction of the prestigious Awards "Castellorizian of the Year", has by far been the most successful initiative introduced by your society. Its acceptance by recipients Senator Nick Bolkus and Michael G. Kailis has been most gratifying. At a recent Sub-committee meeting, the criteria for selection of future Castellorizians of the Year has been clarified as follows:

The Castellorizian of the year is awarded to a person of Castellorizian descent whose achievements have been an inspiration to the Castellorizian communities of Australia. Their achievements can be in the state, national or international arena or areas such as social, community or cultural development, research or economic development. Categories can be interpreted broadly, and the nomination should relate to work accomplished over the culmination of many years or during the preceding 12 months.

V.C.E. AWARDS - The presentation to V.C.E. students in 1994 was also favourably received by parents and members. I hope that these Presentations, together with the Castellorizian of the Year, will become annual events.

70th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS IN 1995 - Next year we celebrate the 70th year of our foundation and we hope that members will support all our functions and activities during our 70th Year. Let us

pause and give a thought to those Pioneers who had the foresight and strength to band together in a strange country to form a brotherhood.

SENIOR CITIZENS - The most gratifying initiative that your Board has introduced in 1994 has, of course, been the monthly meetings of our senior citizens. Under the guidance of Nick Patiniotis, Steve Zombos, Jack N. Miriklis, Katina Miriklis and Sylvia Coates, the Club continues to increase in the numbers attending. We wish the Sub-committee every success, and assure them that they have the full unequivocal support and gratitude of the Board of Management.

BUILDING - Our Building is occupied by an excellent tenant who has, since his occupancy, paid his rental rates and taxes without delay. Our tenant is on a monthly tenancy. However, the maintenance of the building is now causing concern. The roof of the Building has deteriorated to such an extent where total replacement is necessary. Over the past 10 years, approximately \$17,000 has been spent on repairs. As our building is currently listed under the "Historic Building Register" which describes the building as an "A Grade listed building in South Melbourne with historic, aesthetic and social value". All attempts to have the slate roof replaced with other materials by appeal to Council have failed. Further, appeal to Council for financial assistance in the form a low interest loan is still pending. The cost of replacement is \$50,000. We will keep members informed as to the progress of the problem.

HONOUR BOARD - This year will see the placement of the long-overdue Honour Board for Ex-servicemen in our Club Rooms. All other Boards will also be bought up to date and returned to the Club Rooms. I thank the Sub-committee for their final list and report. Thank you Michael Kyriakos, John Trellis, Alick Jackomos O.A.M. Their full report will be printed in our next newsletter.

CLUB ROOMS - As soon as funds become available, we will proceed with stage 2 and up-grading the kitchen, the covering etc. of our courtyard and installation of Television and Video facilities. I remind that our Club Rooms are available for hire to members, and members only.

NEWSLETTER - Our Newsletter continues to be accepted by members. We thank all those members who took time to write to us with news items, stories, profiles etc. However, the most disappointing aspect is those members who do not notify us of a change of address, when this happens their names are automatically dropped off the mailing list. The introduction of a Greek Section edited by Mr. Steve Zombos, our Vice President, has also been well received by members.

IN CONCLUSION - Thanks to all those members who have supported us. To those members of the Board who are not seeking re-election, thank you and good luck.
