Eulogy to a gentle lady Mrs Poppy Diamond as spoken by her Grandson Damian Oorloff

Funerals are always sad and somber affairs with good reason. Each and every attendee has lost someone dear to them, be it a father, mother, sister, brother, uncle, aunt or friend.

The thought of never conversing, seeing, teasing, laughing with this person again seems unimaginable.

This case is no exception and this time it

is my Grandmother - my Yaya who in her own eccentric way, was a guiding light through some rocky times. Anyone who knew Poppy Diamond, knew her as a strong wiled, almost dogmatic woman, but you could never stop admiring her for what she achieved in her life, three children, one daughter and two sons, four grandchildren, one girl and three boys, and one great grandson.

All this from a women who when she arrived on these shores at the age of seventeen in 1935, not being able to speak a work of English, with no friends to ease her pain. I think of how I would cope being placed in a foreign country, not being able to speak a work of the language, knowing no one. Scary thought isn't it?

But Poppy managed her way through all this and taught herself to read, write and speak fluently, but not always accurately. Every birthday card was a dictionaries dream, but I did not care because I loved my Grandmother for who she was - we all did. But 'did' is such an inappropriate word at this time - 'do' is more appropriate.

Let's celebrate her love that we were so blessed to receive and not mourn the loss of it. Every time you shed a tear thinking of Yaya, you will be losing a part of her. Smiles, and only smiles are acceptable for a woman so wonderful as Poppy Diamond. Anything less would not do justice to the amazing life she had. She will always be my Grandmother, always the guiding influence.

I will celebrate her life and not wallow in the loss of it - as we all should.

Mary was born in Darwin on the 30th November 1919. SHe was the eldest child of George Kyriakos and Christina Kailis. She had four brothers and three sisters and in the earlier part of her life, took the responsibility for raising her younger siblings. She was fondly known as "the meyali" by her brothers and sisters Jack, Michael, Evelyn, Eve, Herb and John. After her mothers death, Mary took

the place as the matriarch of the Kyriakos family. Her family moved to Perth in 1926 where she lived until 1939. During this time, she attended James Street and Highgate Hill primary and then attended Perth Technical College where she won an award for Dress Design. She then moved to Kalgoorlie before moving to Melbourne to marry Economos (Tom) Adgemis on the 30th November, 1941. In partnership with her husband Tom, they worked hard togther in their two fruit shops, firstly in Brunswick and then in Kew. Many of you would have fond recollections of Mary driving their red delivery truck with great skill, tenacity and confidence.

Mary was an active, energetic and hardworking member of the community. Her extensive community service is represented by her participation in the following associations:- Member of the Greek brans of the Red Cross for which she received a Certificate of Merit Member of the Kew Senior Citizens where she also delivered Meals on Wheels with Tom in her latter years. A trustee of the Castellorizian Building Society Treasure of the Castellorizian Ladies Society Committee member of the Our Lady Greek Orthodox Church in Balwyn Memer of the Filoptoho - "Friends of the Poor"

Mary was dearly loved and well respected by all members of both the Adgemis and Kyriakos families. As she didn't have any children of her own, she cared about and supported all members of her extended family and took an active interest in their lives. These feelings were reciprocated with great affection and warmth by all her family.

Mary and Tom were happily married for 54 years. Their wonderful bond over this time provided one another with love, company and many special moment. She was a creative and talented person and this was shown through her cake decorating, floral art, dressmaking and embroidery skills.

Mary was a devout Christian, an honest, loving and caring person who was always a romantic at heart. She will be fondly remembered and sadly missed by her family and all the other people whose lives she touched.
