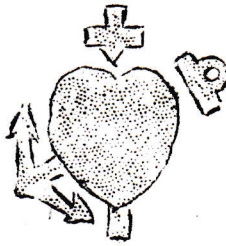

The Official Opening of the New Castellorizian Club at Kingsford was on the 6th October 1973. The original Club constitution was prepared on the 15th June 1924, and had to be sent to Greece to be typed because it could not be done in Sydney.

LONSDALE STREET MALL

We print the following letter from the Melbourne City Council under the signature of Cr Nick Zervos. I am sure that most of our members would endorse the concept as set out in the letter.

12th June 1984

Dear Rate Payer,

As you may be aware, there has been publicity given to the establishment of a Lonsdale Street Pedestrian Mall, especially by Neos Kosmos Newspaper.

In order for such a concept to be considered by the Melbourne City Council, it would be necessary for all rate payers in Lonsdale Street to collectively work towards this project.

In recent days I have been approached by a number of people who would like to see Lonsdale Street re-developed in a manner which would reflect the Greek way of life that already exists. There are a number of obstacles that would face any application to Melbourne City Council that must be overcome, such as carparking and traffic control along Lonsdale Street. As a result of this demand I have taken the liberty to organise a meeting which hopefully would create a Lonsdale Street Traders Association for the purpose of determining the future physical landscape of the area.

The meeting has been arranged for Tuesday 26th day of June 1984 at 6.00 pm, Committee Room No. 3, second floor, Melbourne Town Hall.

I hope that you will be able to attend this important meeting and I would be grateful if you could confirm your availability by the 22nd day of June.

*France's highest award - The Croix de Guerre - awarded to the
Island of Castellorizo for heroic service during World War I*

Croix de Guerre

Citation *à L'ordre l'armée L'île de Castellorizo*

*L'île de Castellorizo, soumise
sous l'occupation française à des
bombardements fréquents de la part
des batteries turques, a toujours
gardé un moral très élevé, affirmant
constamment sa certitude de la
victoire des Alliés. La population a
fait preuve, sous le feu, de courage
et de ténacité et a efficacement
aidé les marins français en hissant,
au prix des plus grandes difficultés,
à leur position de tir, quatre canons
de 120 m/m qui réduisirent au silence
l'artillerie ennemie; les femmes et
les enfants transportant des milliers
d'obus, l'eau et les vivres nécessaires
au ravitaillement.*

*The Island of Castellorizo,
subjected under the French
occupation to frequent bombardments
by the Turkish artillery, always
maintained a highly elevated morale,
constantly confirming its confidence in
the victory of the allies. The population,
while under fire, displayed courage and
tenacity and effectively assisted the
French sailors under the most difficult
conditions to place, in their firing
positions, four 120 m/m cannons which
reduced the enemy artillery to
silence; the women and children
carrying thousands of bomb shells,
water and the necessary provisions
for survival.*

*Paris le 23 Octobre 1920

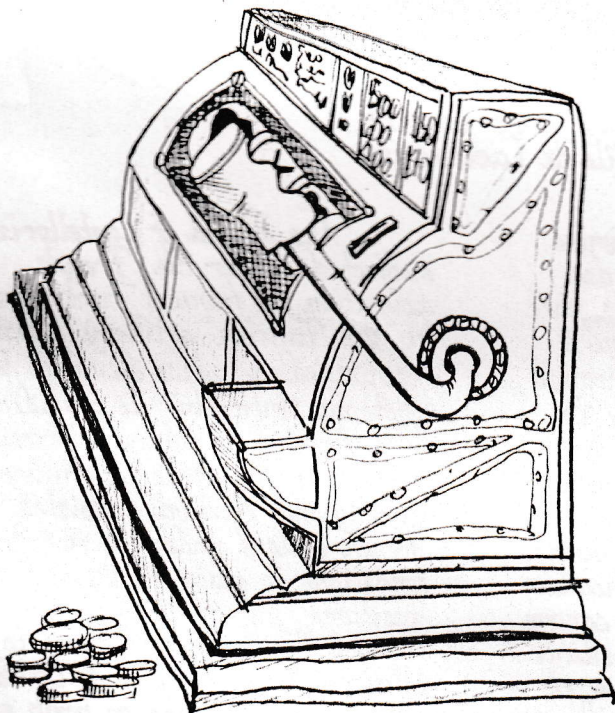
