

"SPORTS NEWS" - PROUD TO BE CASTELLORIZIAN

STEVE MALAXOS of Claremont in Perth is rapidly becoming the most honoured sportsman to have Castellorizian origins. The youngest son of George Malaxos (of Kalaf's fruit shop in Subiaco) and Despo Malaxos (daughter of Sion and Assymina Xanthis), he is 23 years of age and already has just about won all the prizes the game of Aussie Rules has to offer. Although he has, for most of the season, been vice-Captain of his Claremont Club first-grade team, Steve was recently selected the Captain of the Australia "Aussie Rules" Football Team to play in Ireland this coming October. This prestigious team was selected from the players in the VFL, as well as those in South Australia, Tasmania and of course, Western Australia.

Steve's sporting history would, for someone of his age, be unequalled by anyone in Rules football in Australia, and it is arguable that his success could be matched by very few in any sport at this stage in his career.

He first represented Western Australia when selected in the Under 16 State School-boys team which played the Interstate series in Sydney. While 17 and still at school, he was selected to play for his Claremont Club first grade team, He quickly became an established first team player and was a prominent member of the side that won the WA premiership in 1981. During all this, he managed to pay first grade Cricket in Perth at the age of 15 and came to NSW with the WA Schoolbeys team in 1978-79. The following year he toured New Zealand with the Under 19 Cricket Team.

He gave up Cricket to concentrate on his football and this was rewarded when he was selected in the WA State Squad in 1983. In May of this year as vice-Captain of Claremont, Steve assumed the Club captaincy when the selected Captain was carried from the field during the course of play. Claremont were having one of their longest losing sequences in living memory and were second from bottom. Under Steve's captaincy, Claremont 'turned the corner' and began winning games again. This resulted in Steve being selected as Captain of Western Australia to play South Australia. The Western Australia team won the game - only the second WA State side ever to achieve a victory in Adelaide.

This was followed by Western Australia's victory over the Victorian team in the State of Origin match in Perth in June with Steve again The Skipper. As a result of his outstanding performance and leadership displayed in the interstate clashes, Steve Malaxos was selected Captain of the all-Australian squad of 30 of the finest Aussie Rules footballers.

Last year, Steve won each and every media award for his performance in the Perth competition. There are strong rumours that a substantial offer has been made by 1983 VFL Premiers, Hawthorn, to Steve to play for them in 1985. With the very greatest anticipation, we look forward to his impending move to Melbourne and his performances in the VFL. In the meantime, we wish Steve the very best of success in his local competition and in his Captaincy in Ireland and we congratulate a sports champion whose achievements are a great source of pride for all sports lovers of Greek origin and in particular for the Castellorizian Community.

At the AGM the 1983/84 President Jack Bisas presented the Annual General Report. The Report consists of 28 pages and is available in full to any interested members by ringing the Director of Social Services, Mr Nick Polites, on 662 2868. Some of the background of AGWS is as follows -

The Australian Greek Welfare Society is a properly constituted body registered with the Attorney General and was established in 1972. The aims and objectives of the Society are to care for the welfare, health and education of disadvantaged groups in particular Australians from a non-English speaking background. The AGWS is especially concerned and involved with problems and solutions as they effect the Australian Greek Community. The AGWS has 35 full-time employees and many volunteers involved in EDUCATION (including careers, psychological and educational counselling);

WELFARE (In 1983/84 14,000 case contacts); WELFARE RIGHTS (full-time, occasional and emergency child care); OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS CARE AND PLAYGROUPS; YOUTH; INDUSTRIAL HEALTH: MARRIAGE AND FAMILY (Counselling); HEALTH, CARE OF THE ELDERLY (Including Elderly Citizens Clubs at Box Hill, Richmond, Lalor, Preston and consultants to Frankston, Altona, Nunawading, Oakleigh Elderly Clubs; COMMUNITY ARTS; EMPLOYMENT INITIATIVES PROGRAMS (funds to employ staff arise mainly from state and Federal Government grants); a CHILD CARE and FAMILY CENTRE is conducted in Richmond. The Society employs in its welfare unit 3 social workers, 2 welfare officers and a marital counsellor.

NEWS FROM CASTELLORIZO - BY MR P A KAILLIS - SEPTEMBER 1984

AIR STRIP - Work at the Castellorizo new airstrip is continuing and official reports put the completion by the end of 1984. Our personal view is that this completion will take place sometime later than anticipated and we have approached the relevant authorities expressing our dissatisfaction at the slow progress and requesting at the same time to hasten the completion of the project.

PIER PROJECT - Work on the pier project on the Castellorizo harbour has started and it is expected that this will be finished by the end of this current year, when big liners will be able to enter the harbour with ease and safety.

HOSPITAL - Work has also started at the "KAZARMA" and the new island's hospital both of which will be ready by the next tourist season in 1985.

RE-BUILDING RENOVATION OF HOMES - We remind all Castellorizians that grants up to 1,000,000 DRS are given to house owners wanting to repair their homes or build new ones on the island. Details of this will be sent to all Brotherhoods or if any information is required, please write to Mr S Scopelitis, General Secretary, World Castellorizian Brotherhood, 11 Ameririkis, Rhodes, Greece.

NEW MUSEUM - The construction of the new museum building is completed. The new building called "KONAKI" will house in the very near future all historical findings which refer to the history of the island.

NEW SCHOOL - The Prime Minister of Greece has announced that irrespective of the number of pupils available, the establishment of a High School will take place on the island as soon as possible.

VISIT TO AUSTRALIA - The Chairman of the World Castellorizian Brotherhoods, Mr P A Kaillis, will be visiting Australia between 22 December 1984 and 6 January 1985. Mr P A Kaillis has requested that a meeting of representatives from all Australian Brotherhoods meet in Perth Western Australia, during his visit. The object of the meeting would be to hold discussions on the following subjects - Ad MO 20190

- a. The continuation of the World Castellorizian Brotherhood, and applied tags
- b. St Georges Fund

PROFILE ON DR ERNEST HONDROS - FELLOW OF THE ROYAL SOCIETY of ad bloom gritagen and

Dr Ernest Hondros has been elected a fellow of the Royal Society - sunitros and as

Dr Hondros was born in Castellorizo, the third son of Demetrie (dec) and Athanasia Hondros. The family came to Australia and settled in Cairns Queensland. He attended Parramatta school and then on to the Cairns High School, where he became Head Prefect. Upon graduation, he went on to study Science with metallurgy as a major subject at the Melbourne University, where he obtained his BSc and MSc. Dr Hondros went on to win a Scholarship to the University of Paris, where he obtained his PhD, he then joined the National Physical Laboratory (NPL) in Teddington London, in 1962.

In 1979 Ernest was promoted to superintendent of the N.P.L's division of material applications. He is distinguished for his research on the structure and chemical composition and energy of surfaces and interfaces of materials. Dr Hondro's work is of importance in many industrial applications; for example, the prevention of catastrophic forms of failure in steels and the mode of operation of some conductor materials in micro-electronics.

He obtained his Dr Sc from Melbourne University and the American Society of Met allurgists presented him with "The Henry Marion House" medal in 1977. The Royal Society consists of 500 members, is world-wide and Dr Hondros is the first Castellorizian to be made a Fellow. He is often in demand for lectures throughout USA, Europe, Canada and the UK. Dr Hondros is married and lives with his wife Kristine and sons Dimitrie and Constantine in Kingston Vale London.

- 4) Εάν πρόκειται για Έλληνα του Εξωτερικού βεβαίωση από τις αρμόδιες Ελλήσικές Προξενικές αρχές με τηνοποία βεβαιώνεται ο χρόνος συνεχούς διαμονής του ενδιαφερομένου στο εξωτερικό για χρονικό διάστημα μεγαλύτερο της τριετίας από την ημέρα υποβολής της αίτησης.
- 5) Σχέδια Μηχανικού για τις προς εκτέλεση εξωτερικές και εσωτερικές εργασίες κατασκλευής, επισκευής, συντήρησης και διαμόρφωσης του οικήματος, σε τρία αντίγραφα.
- 6) Αναλυτικό και συνολικό προϋπολογισμό Μηχανικού για τις προς εκτέλεση εργασίες, σε τρία αντίγραφα.
- 7) Υπεύθυνη δήλωση του Ν.105 για την υποχρέωση συμμετοχής του ιδιοκτήτη στο κόστος εργασιών κατά 50% (35% για τους Έλληνες του Εζωτερικού εφόσον η συμμετοχή τους είναι σε συνάλλαγμα) είτε από δικά
 του κεφάλαια είτε από δάνει ο της ΕΚΤΕ.

Σημειώνουμε ότι η επιχορή~ηση μπορεί να φθάσει το 50% του συνολικού προϋπολογισμού (65% εφόσον πρόκειται για Έλληνες Εζωτερικού και η συμμετοχή τους είναι σε συνάλλαγμα) μέχρι ύψους ενός εκατομμυρίου δραχμών.
