

PROFILE NO. 2

ANDREW JACKOMOS 1896-

Andrew, the second son of Alic and Panayota Jackomos, nee Kalis, was born in Kastelorizo in February, 1896; the other children were Yakomi (dec) 1894 and Megthalia, 1898.

Andrew came from a family with a long life record, his Father Alic died in Melbourne in 1948 at the age of 101. His grandfather Yakomi died in Kastelorizo at the age of 105.

Andrew's father had a boat and regularly travelled to Turkey trading with the Turks. Andrew and his brother, Yakomi, as young boys accompanied and worked with their father on these trips.

Still in his early teens, Andrew was employed on one of the many boats operating from Kastelorizo, diving for sponges on the floor of the Mediteranean.

In 1912, Andrew's father came to Australia. After spending some time in Perth, he returned to Kastelorizo. In 1914 Alic again travelled to Australia, this time bringing his two sons Yakomi and Andrew. His wife, Panayota and daughter Megthalia were to remain in Kastelorizo until 1917.

PROFILE NO. 2 - ANDREW JACKOMOS - CONT.

It was 1914 and the 1st World War had commenced and a group of Kastelorizians had settled in Perth. The north of Australia in those days was undeveloped and Alic and his two sons Yakomi and Andrew, travelled by boat to Port Darwin, as it was known in those days. Wages in the North were much higher and Andrew remembers his first job, when he received \$1.85 per day.

After spending three years in Darwin, Alic returned to Kastelorizo in 1917 and again returned to Perth with his wife Panayota and daughter Megthalia, who had married Steve Pallaras.

By 1920, all of Alic's family, his brothers and sisters (Ariti, Angelo, John, Basil and Mick) and their families had migrated to Perth. In later years, some of the family migrated to Adelaide and Melbourne.

For five years Andrew worked in Darwin and Pine Creek on the Darwin to Larrimah Railway construction line. From there he spent some time working his way back to Perth, spending some time in Wyndham and Broome in North West Australia, eventually returning to Perth in 1919.

Alic and his two sons, like many others, moved into the fish business. They would purchase fish from the Perth Fish market and with their cane baskets would walk around Perth hawking the fish from house to house.

In 1920, Alic and Panayota and their three children moved to Adelaide.

In 1922, Andrew and his parents moved on to Melbourne. During that period, the Greek population was small, which included the Castelorizian families of Mangos, Bisas, Spartels, Fermanis, Conos, Augustes, Kanis, George, Adgemis, Penglis, Ammonis and Christofis.

In 1923 Asimina Augustes arrived in Melbourne to be with her brothers, Manuel and Peter and sister Florry, who was married to Mick Conos. (Mr. Mick Conos became the first President of our Castellorizian Brotherhood in 1925).

On the 1st April, 1923, Andrew Jackomos married Asimina Augustes at the Greek Orthodox Church "Evangelismou", which was the only Greek Church in Melbourne at the time.

In 1928 Andrew and Asimina were naturalized as Australian citizens.

Over the next 30 years, besides raising a family of six children, Alick, Mary (dec), Angelo, Stella, Maisie and Michael, they operated fish shops in the Carlton district plus a few years in Collingwood, Balaclava and Northcote.

In those days, during the great Depression, working hours were long, rising at 5 am for market and closing the fish shop at midnight every day except Sundays, when the cleaning up was done.

In those days, fish was cooked in wood stoves, wood to be chopped and potatoes peeled by hand. Fish prices were Coutta - 2 pence a piece ($1\frac{1}{2}$ cents) and Flake - 3 pence (2 cents) a piece. You could buy 1 cent of chips.

In the mid 1930's, Nick Koutsoukos conducted a cafe in Lonsdale Street and sold 3 course meals with bread and butter, a cup of tea for sixpence (5 ϕ).

In 1955 Andrew and Asimina retired from their fish shop in Elgin St, Carlton, and settled in a little cottage in Station St, with their youngest son Michael, all the other children had since married.

In 1961 Andrew re-entered the work force and was employed in a nearby mattress factory, finally retiring in 1968 at the age of 72 years.

In 1965 Andrew and Asimina moved to East Kew where they still reside.

PROFILE NO. 2 - ANDREW JACKOMOS - CONT.

Unfortunately, Andrew lost sight of both eyes eight years ago.

The children and grandchildren of Andrew and Asimina Jackomos have made a great contribution to this country.

- Alick enlisted in the Australian Army at the age of 17 and saw service in Papua New Guinea and Dutch East Indies. For many years he wrestled professionally in the light heavy weight division at Festival Hall and other capital city stadiums.
- Angelo enlisted in the British occupation forces and served with the Allied forces in the occupation of Japan.
- Michael, the youngest of all the three sons, played with Carlton under nineteens Football Club.
- Grandson Andrew has been prominent in Australian Diving competition during the last ten years. Andrew is a four times Australian Diving champion and was a medal winner at the 1947 Commonwealth Games in Christchurch, New Zealand. Andrew has represented Australia in Russia, New Zealand, U.S.A., Canada, Italy, Bulgaria, Columbia, Equador, Austria and Sweden. In 1980 he was the Australian 10 metre champion.
- Granddaughter Dianna, has been diving for six years and is modelling the diving techniques of her brother Andrew, who is her coach.

Dianna has won five straight championships during the past 6 months and finished 3rd in the schools Pan Pacific Games in Brisbane.

She is now confident that she will enhance her record at the World Championships in New Zealand in August 1983.
