

SENATOR GEORGE GEORGES

Senator Georges was elected to the Senate in 1968, and has served the A.L.P. for 30 years. Born in Darwin, N/T. in 1920, he has two children - Arthur and Sandra. Educated in Queensland - went to Brisbane State and on to Queensland University.

Although some might not agree with the Senator's stand on many issues, we must admire his decision to resign from the A.L.P. as a matter of principle. The Senator, who is of Castellorizian origin, has taken opposite views on many of the current policies, including "The Australia Card", and other important issues: The Closing down of the Institute of Multi-Cultural Affairs; The Amalgamation of the A.B.C. and S.B.S; the Severe funding cuts to the E.S.L. Programme, and the cut-back in the Grant In Aid Programme. Not only Senator Georges, but many others of our members who are involved in community affairs, are just as worried as the Senator as to the severity of the above funding cuts.

There are two Senators in Parliament of Castellorizian origin - Senator George Georges and Senator Nick Bolkus.

November 7th: "Extract from Monash Reporter":

A Senate Select Committee visited Monash University in October, 1986. Members of the Senate Select Committee are Senator George Georges, Senator David Brownhill, Senator Norm Sanders.

The Select Committee has been set up to report on "Ethics in Animal Experimentation".

MICHAEL PASPALIS 1914-1972.

Any of our Members who have been to Darwin cannot have failed to see the name "Paspalis" featured on many buildings, including the Darwin Hotel, Paspalis Centrepoint, the old Fanny Bay Hotel property and many others.

Probably the best known Greek name in the Territory would be the name "Paspalis".

Michael Paspalis was born in Castellorizo in 1914 and arrived in Australia in 1919. He went to live in Darwin, N/T. in 1927. He married Chrissie (Kailis) on the 27th January, 1935, and there were two daughters from the marriage - Phenia and Helene.

Phenia married lawyer Peter Paroulakis of Melbourne. Peter is the son of Dr. Haralambos and Helen (Michaelidis).

Helene is married to lawyer Peter Coumbis of Sydney.

In 1964 Michael Paspalis was awarded the M.B.E. for services to the Northern Territory, and in particular, Darwin. Mrs. Paspalis still lives in Darwin and takes an active part in managing the Paspalis Group of Companies. She still supervises the Darwin Hotel and Convention Centre on a daily basis.

Michael Paspalis acquired his first two cottages in Darwin in 1933 and built his first home in Smith Street in 1937. In February 1942 he completed "Roslyn Court". In 1946, after the 2nd World War, he completed the first wing extensions to the Darwin Hotel. In 1958 he built Darwin's first open-air Parah Theatre and in 1959 he acquired the Fanny Bay Hotel. In 1962 he built Darwin's first Drive-in Theatre. In 1968 he acquired the R.S.L. and Dental Clinics, which were to be the site for the Centre-Point in the heart of Darwin.

During this period Mr. Michael Paspalis was also very active in community affairs. He made many donations and assisted many charities! He also donated to charitable institutions and communities outside of the Northern Territory.

In 1970 he donated \$30,000 to the Greek Archdiocese School of New South Wales. In 1969 he presented the first complete Ambulance to the St. John's Ambulance Service.

He was a sponsor of the Nightcliffe Youth Club, and also made many donations to the Northern Territory's First Greek Church, Heart Foundation and other Northern Territory Charities.

I thank Mrs. Chrissie Paspalis for allowing me to examine papers, files, photographs, etc., from her own personal records of her late husband, Mr. Michael Paspalis, M.B.E.
