CASTELLORIZO - A GREEK TRAGEDY Final part

Kailis's rags-to-riches rise as one of Australia's biggest fishing entrepreneurs is another story, but he admitted that his grandfather's seafaring heritage was the driving force for him to try to earn a living from the sea. "It was in my blood," he said.

His doctor wife Patricia, a descendant of Captain Bligh, shares his love for Castellorizo - and the sea.

They try to spend a few weeks every northern summer at their villa on the island.

We arrived on the island by light aircraft in a scenic flight from Rhodes, the nearest big island.

Our departure from Castellorizo after four idyllic days was less than spectacular.

The ferry for Rhodes was due to arrive around 8.0am. "But be ready and packed at 3.0am, because sometimes it arrives early," we were told.

At 3.0am we were jolted awake by the blare of the ferry horn almost outside our window and even at that ungodly hour we had a retinue of friends we had known only a few days on the dock to wave farewell. They had heard the ferry's horn, too.
